Dear St. Joseph Parish Family,

Tomorrow is the Solemnity of the **Assumption** of the Blessed Virgin Mary (into heaven). Normally, on this solemnity there is an obligation for all Catholics to attend Mass; however, because it falls on a Monday this year there is no obligation. Therefore, our only Mass that day will be our 12:10pm daily Mass. The Catholic Center will have Mass at 5:15pm on Monday.

Mass tidbit:

The Mass has its own proper music; however, it's rare to hear that music. At St. Joseph's we do use the proper music of the Mass with our traditional choir (at the 5:30 Vigil Mass and the 11:30 Sunday Mass). The proper music for the beginning of Mass is called the **Introit** and there is a proper Introit text and music for every Sunday and Feast Day. It's set to Gregorian chant, the traditional music of the Church that goes back to late Roman Empire and Medieval period. Under the modern Roman Rite, the Introit can be replaced with a hymn, which is almost always done in America. At our traditional music Masses, however, we sing a hymn during the procession and chant the Introit while the altar is being incensed. When hearing the Introit we're hearing what the Church has sung for over a thousand years. We can hear our union with the Church across many centuries. Let us be grateful for the wonderful patrimony handed on to us!

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

Jeremiah urged the people of Jerusalem to surrender to the enemy. This angered the princes, who then requested that Jeremiah be put to death. The king allowed the princes to leave him in a cistern without food or water. But after Ebed Melech pleaded for Jeremiah's life, the king decided to free him.

Second Reading: Hebrews 12:1-4

This letter to the Hebrews inspires all Christians to persevere, in spite of the trials they may face. Jesus endured much suffering and was rewarded by God. Despite our struggles, we must remember Jesus' ability to endure and maintain strong faith in him.

Gospel: Luke 12:49-53

Jesus tells his disciples that his message will not bring peace to the earth. Instead, even families will become sharply divided because some members will embrace him, while others condemn him.
