A Word From Our Pastor

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Our fearless leader, Fr. Boniface, is away for a couple of weeks of rest in glorious New England. This is last weekend our two younger student brothers will be with us. Brs. Raphael and Thomas will have some time with their families later this week before they return to Washington, D.C. to resume their studies. We still have another week with Fr. Bartholomew and two with Br. Brendan.

In today's Gospel, the Apostles ask Jesus a pretty common question: how do we pray? I wonder what kind of answer the disciples expected to hear. Today we'd probably be expecting to be recommended an app or book or technique. We'd certainly expect to have to use our words and involve our own self-expression.

Jesus's answer, however, is confoundingly simple:

He said to them, "When you pray, say:
Father, hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come.
Give us each day our daily bread
and forgive us our sins
for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us,
and do not subject us to the final test."

He just gives us the Our Father (the version we're used to comes from Matthew's Gospel). Praying can be as simple as using words that we have been given that have memorized as children. However elaborate our life of private prayer might become, we will never have words as perfect as what Christ gave us.

There is obviously a time and place to tell God our thoughts and fears, to ask him for specific needs, to pray the psalms or devotions composed by saints for specific occasions, but not finding the right words should never be reason to avoid a life of prayer.

**SEVENTEETH SUNDAY
IN ORDINARY TIME**

First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32

Abraham pleads with the Lord, who planned to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah because of the evil and sin in those cities. Abraham asks him if he would spare the city if fifty, forty, thirty, twenty or even only ten innocent people were found there. God says that he would spare the cities even for the sake of only ten.

Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14

Paul explains to the Colossians that through baptism, they are raised to life with Christ because they believed in the power of the God who raised him from the dead. Even though they once lived in sin, their sins have been pardoned through Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

Jesus' disciples asked him how they should pray. He gave them some phrases similar to those now used in the Lord's prayer. Jesus also reminds the disciples how even men with sins are able to give good things to their children, and explains how much more the heavenly Father wants to give to us.
