## PENTECOST SUNDAY First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

The disciples were celebrating Pentecost together when "tongues of fire appeared which parted, then came to rest on each of them." The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in foreign tongues. Visitors from many different countries were amazed that each guest could hear his or her native language being spoken as the disciples proclaimed God's glory.

## Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

## **Gospel: John 20:19-23**
